I had no idea what it took to keep things moving in a forward motion for our community. The learning experience has been incredible! There seems to be a misnomer that one must have experience to be on the board. That is farthest from the truth! Like any job, you learn as you go! And with a team of friendly volunteers to work with, it becomes a well-greased wheel! This year we have had some interesting challenges to deal with. The biggest is of course COVID-19! Wow! Who knew?! Again, learned a lot!!! I urge all of you to take your turn as a volunteer and not look at it as a commitment, but rather a temporary adventure and a way to be a part of what makes Steeplechase STEEPLECHASE!!! Think of how YOU could add different ideas to improve or add to our usual routine. Think outside the box and make it fun! and any changes you would like to make to improve our community! These may be dropped in the pool mailbox or given to a current board member. WE NEED YOU!!!

There will be an Annual Dues Increase of \$100.00/yr/household on the ballot. Last year we almost had enough votes to pass. It is essential that we raise our dues to balance the expenses we are enduring year to year. Our annual maintenance commitments are only \$2,100 less than the money we collect from every household. Comparatively speaking, we are HUNDREDS OF DOLLARS BE-HIND MOST OF OUR SURROUND-ING ADDITIONS! Steeplechase is over 20 years old now and showing its age. The pool and grounds are always our biggest expenses, but this year, we had major issues that arose that took more funds that were budgeted for. Let me be clear, there are even larger ones ahead of us and if we don't start getting our dues increased to an acceptable amount, we will be forced to ask for assessments well over \$1000.00. So please be prepared to vote "YES" on the dues increase to prevent this from happening. Our dam in the east pond has MULTIPLE leaks that are becoming larger everyday. At some point, that dam will break and we will lose all the water in both ponds, as they are connected! These are not scare tactics, these are facts! We have recently found out through a professional arborist that our huge beautiful elm at the west end of the west pond has Dutch Elm Disease. This is a fungus that is spread and carried to other trees by the Dutch Elm beetle. We are currently getting estimates to have it taken down and disposed of to try to prevent further spreading. If you have any elm trees in your yard, I highly suggest you take precautions to prevent the fungus from attacking it. This is yet another unexpected large expense that we have incurred this year. There is no stopping nature, but we can be better prepared to deal with it if our funds are in order. Please consider this when voting on the dues increase.

On a final note, I would like to thank everyone for their patience with the changes we have had to make to allow for safety during this pandemic. But the silver lining is that I do believe it has brought us all a little bit closer together as a community! Stay healthy and happy!!!

# The American Flag Etiquette



of its proud citizens and the embodiment of our values as Americans. Its design embodies our origins, our unity and our vision. The colors represent our Country's virtues, such as bravery, purity and justice.

The flag of the United States is the distinctive symbol

The display and care of our flag is codified by Congressional Resolution. This code standardizes the design, presentation and disposal of our Nation's emblem so that it is flown uniformly around the world. Here are excerpts from the code that describe proper care and display of the flag:



- The flag should be displayed from sunrise 1. to dusk.
- 2. The flag may be displayed at night, if adequately illuminated.
- The flag shouldn't be flown in inclement 3. weather, unless it is an "All Weather" flag.
- 4 The flag should be hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously.
- If hung vertically on a wall or porch, the Union (the blue 5. field of stars) should be in the top left corner.
- The flag should never be worn as an article of clothing. 6. 7. The flag should never touch the ground or anything
- beneath it.
- 8. The flag is flown at half-mast during periods of national mourning but hoisted to its peak for an instant before lowering it.
- 9. When a flag becomes worn, faded or frayed, it should be disposed of ceremoniously. This can be done by your local Scouts or American Legion Post.
- 10. When not on display, the flag should be folded into a triangle with the Union visible
